Council is asked to consider and approve the Council Briefing and Development Plan for 2025.

Building on the 2024 topics, staff are recommending four interconnected sessions for 2025. These sessions will provide the essential shared understanding and context needed for the Council to effectively fulfill its oversight role. They will also align with the strategic enablers and, where appropriate, will incorporate interactive elements.

## Session 1: College Governance Model Refresher

This session will provide an overview of the College's Governance model, highlighting the Council and Committee structures and accountabilities in accordance with the Ontario College of Teachers Act, 1996 and its regulations.

# Session 2: Understanding the Education Ecosystem

This session will provide an overview of system partners and our role as the regulator within the education ecosystem.

#### Session 3: Decision-Making in the Public Interest

This session will provide an overview of Council's fiduciary duties with a focus on principles related to transparency and accountability

### Session 4: Moving towards a Barrier-Free Regulatory Model

This session will provide an overview of how the College is integrating into its processes the enabler of a regulatory model that strives to be free from barriers to truth and reconciliation, and equity, diversity, inclusion, and access.

It is anticipated that each session will be presented by College staff, advisors, or guests and will occur immediately following each regular quarterly Council meeting.
