Public Interest Rationale:	Object 3: To accredit professional teacher education programs offered by post-secondary educational institutions.
Strategic Alignment:	Goal 1: Accountable and agile processes to certify educators to teach in Ontario classrooms. Program accreditation and member certification are foundational to the Ontario College of Teachers' dual mandate. Accreditation is a catalyst to certification given that the majority of College members certified in any given year are graduates from Ontario accredited programs of initial teacher education. The Accreditation Committee contributes to this pipeline by rendering each accreditation decision efficiently within the 180 day timeline that is articulated in Ontario Regulation 347/02 Accreditation of Teacher Education Programs (Section 46).

Committee Mandate and Duties

The duties of the Accreditation Committee are outlined in Section 28. (5) of *Ontario Regulation 563/21 General* and are described in Appendix 1 of this document. Further, *Ontario Regulation 347/02, Accreditation of Teacher Education Programs*, describes the decision-rendering mandate of the committee.

Initial Teacher Education Program Reviews and Program Change Decisions

Since the last report to Council on October 5, 2023, the Accreditation Committee has rendered eight decisions pertaining to the accreditation of 13 programs of professional education offered by seven different providers in the province.

Committee Professional Learning and Development

Specialized knowledge and skills are required of Accreditation Committee and Roster members to render informed decisions. Staff provides ongoing training that is highly valued in this development. The training has been impactful and has contributed significantly to the competency of the Accreditation Committee and Roster members. Particular focus has been brought to:

- Determination of sufficient, salient and probative evidence to inform decisionmaking
- Committee capacity to ask good questions
- Connections between initial teacher education research and accreditation requirements
- Capacity-building within committee to identify essential features from panel reports to be included in decisions

In addition to the onboarding sessions for new committee and roster members, the 8-member Accreditation Committee met onsite at the College offices for a face-to-face meeting on February 2, 2024. Staff facilitated a number of professional learning activities on a variety of topics to inform the committee's work. Interactive sessions included extracting information from salient evidence sources, understanding Panel Reports, understanding Multi-session Transitional Certificates of Qualification and Registration and the new Transitional Certificate of Qualification and Registration, and engaging with teacher education research in connection with the work of accreditation. Three guest speakers shared their expertise on topics related to Quality Assurance in Higher Education and Reimaging Teacher Education as a Continuum. Key to the success of the day was the relevance of the sessions to the committee's decision-rendering responsibilities and a recognition of current issues pertaining to initial teacher education.

This opportunity to come together has promoted synergy for the Accreditation Committee. There are better connections between committee members, between committee and staff as well as connections to the work. There is enhanced respect for the knowledge, skills and perspectives that each committee member brings, whether they are a public member or a licensee. What has evolved is a committee initiative to lead the decision deliberation discussion about salient evidence sources that satisfy particular requirements. This member-led discussion was first modelled by the Chair and Vice-Chair at the June committee meeting. Other committee members have volunteered to continue this practice.

Another shared responsibility is seen in committee member willingness to lead the land acknowledgement at the outset of the meeting from their own geographic location.

Launch of Accreditation Resource Guide

The Accreditation Resource Guide is a companion to requirements set out in Regulation 347/02 Accreditation of Teacher Education Programs. Its purpose is to clarify the intent, through additional information and examples, of the core content that should be included in Ontario teacher education programs. The Guide was revised in 2023.

Faculties access the <u>Accreditation Resource Guide (2023)</u> as part of their accreditation renewal process. In the three reviews following the publication of the refreshed content of the Guide, the committee has noted greater evidence of the following elements in the programs' conceptual framework, design and course content:

- Equity, Diversity, Inclusion and Access
- Indigenous Perspectives, Cultures, Histories and Ways of Knowing
- Environmental Learning, Ecojustice and Climate Action
- Integration of Technology as a Teaching and Learning Tool

Responsive client service for all stakeholders

The Accreditation Committee acknowledges that the College has a number of interested and affected educational partners, including the faculties of education that offer accredited programs of initial teacher education. Committee members exercise their responsiveness to program providers in a number of ways, including:

- Rendering accreditation decisions within reasonable timelines in accordance with the regulation
- Articulating conditions on accreditation requirements, if any, in a way that faculties understand what evidence is required in order to satisfy the requirement
- Exercising a reasonable expectation for the accreditation period for a program of professional education in accordance with the regulation

With respect to this third point, in the period since the last report to Council, the Accreditation Committee has received requests from two faculties to consider an extension to the accreditation period for their programs. Rationale cited for the extension requests references uncertainty with respect to anticipated changes to the duration and content of teacher education programs from the provincial government. An accreditation renewal is a significant time and resource investment for faculties and they want to ensure that they will be bringing forward the program that will actually be offered for accreditation. When deliberating on these matters, committee members have the opportunity to consider historic decisions and to consult policy staff for input regarding risks and other considerations.

Appendix 1: Duties and Mandate of the Accreditation Committee

The duties of the Accreditation Committee are limited to,

- (a) determining whether programs of professional education qualify for accreditation under the accreditation regulation;
- (b) determining if accredited programs of professional education qualify for a renewal of accreditation under the accreditation regulation;
- (c) granting accreditation, with or without conditions, to programs of professional education that qualify for accreditation under the accreditation regulation;
- (d) determining, at the direction of the Registrar and in the circumstances permitted by the accreditation regulation, if accredited programs of professional education and accredited programs of additional qualification continue to qualify for accreditation; and
- (e) carrying out any duties assigned to it under Part IV of the accreditation regulation.

Institutions must apply for accreditation before offering a new or substantially changed program of professional education in Ontario.

If a program is accredited, it will be reviewed within the seven-year cycle.

If a program is accredited with conditions, the Accreditation Committee receives and reviews an annual report from the institution on its progress satisfying the accreditation conditions. The committee may issue a decision to modify or remove the conditions.

If a program is denied accreditation, the institution may appeal within 60 days of receiving a copy of the decision. The appeal must set out the grounds and the facts on which it relies and be accompanied by the fee prescribed by the College bylaw.

All Accreditation Committee decisions are posted on the Ontario College of Teachers website for public access and review.
